



AHK Bursary

The AHK Bursary is named after Anne Holton-Krayenbuhl who was a distinguished scholar and archaeologist and a founding member of the Ely and District Archaeological Society. Upon her death in 2015 a memorial fund was set up by her family members,

The fund exists to make financial contributions to students of archaeology studying within Ely and the surrounding district towards the cost of studying and undertaking archaeological investigations within the United Kingdom.

1. Applications for funding must be made in writing to the Ely and District Archaeological Society.
2. Bursary funding will be limited to a maximum of £100.00 per person or £500 per organisation.
3. Applicants/recipients must be aged between 13-18 years of age at the time of the application.
4. The granting of funds will be at the discretion of governing committee of the Ely and District Archaeological Society.
5. Recipients of funding may be required to give a short account of their fund usage and how knowledge or skills gained can be put into practice.
6. The scheme will exist until the fund is exhausted.
